



## Finger Lakes Clue Answers

*Remember: Masks and Social Distancing! Be respectful of others' property.  
If a location is closed (due to COVID-19) snap photos from the parking lot or safe distance.*

1. Its history began in 1852 with entrepreneur DeWitt Parshall. Once two friendly rival banks during the depression era, the two became one on Independence Day 1933 after the banking panic forced the merger.  
**Answer: Lyons National Bank (any location)**
2. Don't let time run out on you as you solve this clue! You may need to step into the "time machine" and learn about the history of timekeeping as the clock keeps ticking!  
**Answer: Hoffman Clock Museum (Newark)**
3. "Animal Crackers" may offer a hint to this rescue farm where large animals can live their best life!  
**Answer: Cracker Box Palace Farm Animal Haven (Wayne County)**
4. This picturesque location offers nostalgic familiarity with a modern design that is perfect for outdoor adventures or romantic getaways. It is the first hotel of its kind on Canandaigua Lake.  
**Answer: The Lake House on Canandaigua (Ontario County)**
5. You might not have *herd* of this farm before....so *I'll pack* the clue with hints! It's an agri-tourism farm that's been family run since 2000 and spans 160 acres to let the animals enjoy lush pastures and comfortable loafing sheds!  
**Answer: Lazy Acre Alpaca Farm (Bloomfield)**
6. This is place houses world-class collection of artifacts that can help take visitors back in time to explore antique technologies and their evolution over the years. No tricks...but also no wires!  
**Answer: Antique Wireless Museum (Bloomfield)**
7. This 17,300-square foot facility built in 2015 is designed to fit into the natural landscape and located on a National Historic Landmark. The facility features an interactive, multi-media Exhibit Gallery, including a changing exhibit space, and Orientation Theater to tell of the art, culture and society of this native group.  
**Answer: Seneca Art & Culture Center at Ganondagan (Victor)**
8. Founded in 1958 and operated by 3 generations it has the largest apricot orchard on the East Coast!  
**Answer: Red Jacket Orchards (Geneva)**
9. First constructed of wood in 1858, this square pyramidal tower was replaced with cast iron in 1938 and can be seen from 10 nautical miles!  
**Answer: Sodus Outer Lighthouse (Wayne County)**
10. At this destination it may pay to be a VIP but anyone looking for an outlet from the day to day may get a premium deal a 100 times over!  
**Answer: Waterloo Premium Outlet Mall (Waterloo)**

11. Founded in 1960, it started as a gravel business until 1989 when it shifted to energy conservation and efficiently managing waste by reusing it to create new products! *(Bonus Hint: If you've solved this clue, then make the trip even more worthwhile and make some drop offs!)*  
**Answer: Alpco Recycling (Macedon)**
12. If you have the spare time you might want to stay here a while before rolling along to the next spot! Hope you don't strike out!  
**Answer: Your community's Bowling Alley**
13. It had a humble beginning in 1948 selling fishing tackle but today sports amateurs and enthusiasts alike have found they can score more and play more here especially in this **"grand" new location** to sport fun!  
*(Bonus Hint: it's a great place for a sporty/outdoorsy selfie)*  
**Answer: Dick's Sporting Goods House of Sports (Victor)**
14. This geometrically named spot in Canandaigua has 3 sides and features a 1929 monument and marker commemorating the 1779 routes of General John Sullivan and General James Clinton  
**Answer: Triangle Park (Canandaigua)**
15. This 1914 landmark Georgian Revival building sits on Main Street in Canandaigua and is home to the antiquities of the area offering a path through history.  
**Answer: Ontario County Historical Society Museum (Canandaigua)**
